Why we want you

Trafford Ward is a 16-bed inpatient rehabilitation and end of life care ward located at North Cambridgeshire Hospital in Wisbech.

We require a Mealtime Support Volunteer to assist staff in ensuring patients are eating and are content during mealtimes.

This is an opportunity to gain experience and skills through direct contact with patients, whilst simultaneously supporting the Trust in providing excellent care.

What you will be doing

- Sitting with patients, talking to them ultimately encouraging the patients to remain seated at the dining table during mealtime
- Where appropriate, you will prompt the patient and encourage the patient to eat, helping them to stay focussed

The skills you need

- A real interest in helping people who may be vulnerable and experiencing a challenging time
- The ability to listen to others and support them in a way that promotes independence, confidence and recovery
- A professional and confidential approach and a good awareness of personal boundaries
- Non-judgmental, open minded and tolerant
- A good sense of humour
- Experience with food hygiene or a dietary background are not necessary but the volunteer may find the role particularly insightful if they have an interest or experience in these areas
